COCA PRESENTS NEW ADAPTATION OF THE NUTCRACKER

Performances to Feature Guest Artists from Dance Theatre of Harlem & COCA Young Performers

ST. LOUIS (November 14, 2024)—This holiday season, COCA will present its first-ever production of <u>The Nutcracker</u> with an exciting adaptation of the holiday classic that follows the lead characters on a journey through historical St. Louis landmarks. *The Nutcracker* is choreographed by guest artist Tom Gold, a former soloist with the New York City Ballet and is set to the original score by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky. Performances are Friday, December 13 at 7:00 p.m., Saturday, December 14 at 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m., and Sunday, December 15 at 1:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m.

In this production, Ballet Eclectica, COCA's Pre-Professional Division classical and contemporary ballet company, and COCA young ballet dancers ages 6–18 will perform alongside two professional dancers from New York City's Dance Theatre of Harlem, Carly Greene and David Wright, and COCA alumna JiaLi Deck, who is currently a freshman at Barnard College studying dance and sociology.

"Our pre-professional ballet company and students of COCA will take the stage with our incredibly talented guest artists to bring this story to life," said Antonio Douthit-Boyd, COCA's Artistic Director of Dance. "This production showcases COCA's commitment to preparing young artists to discover and achieve more than they've ever imagined as well as the continued growth of our Dance Program."

This version of the story of *The Nutcracker* is based on the E.T.A. Hoffmann story *The Nutcracker and the Mouse King* but is set in 1920s St. Louis and features landmarks throughout.
